### Dead man found on boat in Portsmouth

PORTSMOUTH, N.H. – State Police report an untimely death aboard a commercial fishing boat tied to the dock at the Portsmouth Fish Co-Op on Peirce Island.

# Dangerous form of Android spyware found in more than 1,000 apps

Yesterday

SAN FRANCISCO, Calif. — More than 1,000 apps infected with a malevolent strain of spyware have been available in Android marketplaces since February - even in the Google Play Store.

SonicSpy - which was discovered by San Francisco-based mobile security firm Lookout - can take photos, send text messages, track and record phone calls, spy on Wi-Fi access points and more. The spyware likely originated in Iraq and was created by the same hackers behind SpyNote, detected by Palo Alto Networks last year.

SonicSpy was found inside messaging app Soniac, which was downloaded thousands of times by Android device users.

Once downloaded, the malware removes its icon from the smartphone's menu. Then, it grants cybercriminals access to the user's private data by connecting to a command and control server.

Google has eliminated three infected apps from its marketplace - Soniac, Hulk Messenger and Troy Chat - but other applications that may contain the spyware are still available in third-party stores. Up to 5,000 Android users had downloaded Soniac at the time of its removal.

To avoid SonicSpy, Android smartphone owners should refrain from downloading and installing apps from unknown sources. Reading user reviews is also helpful - apps that show suspicious behavior will often have low ratings in the Google Play Store.

Additionally, keep mobile devices updated and install security apps to protect against unwanted infections.

There were 2,227 public data breaches resulting in six billion records stolen as of June 30, 2017, according to a mid-year report from cybersecurity firm Risk Based Security.

Data breaches are becoming more prevalent and will cost an estimated \$8 trillion over the next five years.

You can protect yourself by using a single zero-liability credit card for online purchases, strong passwords using a random combination of numbers and letters, enable two-factor authentication when available, and regularly monitor bank accounts, including all online payment portals. Lastly, sign up for your bank's free credit monitoring service, which will place an alert on your account if it detects any suspicious activity.

# Charlottesville Latest: 3 Killed In Violence Linked To White Nationalist Rally

Yesterday

One person was killed and more than 19 others were injured in Charlottesville, Virginia, after a car plowed through a group of counter-protesters who were demonstrating against an alt-right and white nationalist rally.

Charlottesville Police Chief Al Thomas said a 32-year-old woman was killed and the suspect vehicle which fled was found moments later and a male driver was arrested.

Police on Saturday night said James Alex Fields Jr., 20, of Ohio, was the person arrested and is charged with one count of second-degree murder, three counts of malicious wounding and one count of "hit and run attended failure to stop with injury."

Two Virginia State Police officials were also killed when a police helicopter assisting in law enforcement efforts in Charlottesville crashed southwest of the city at around 5 p.m., the state police and FAA said. Foul play is not suspected, according to the state police.

At 7:30 p.m., the University of Virginia Health System said it was still treating 19 patients from the car crash — five are in critical condition, four are in serious condition, six are fair and four are in good condition.



Pompeo expects North Korea's missile program to continue despite international sanctions.

A new security flaw, discovered by researchers in Belgium, appears to be affecting Wi-Fi connections.

The flaw, called KRACK (short for Key Reinstallation Attack), could let a hacker within range of your device break encryption and potentially steal and manipulate data.

The attacker can trick a device into using an unauthorized Wi-Fi access point. The good news is that there aren't reports of the flaw being exploited.

Companies are issuing patches.

Operating systems at risk, include Google Android, Linux, Apple (AAPL, Tech30) MacOS, Microsoft Windows, OpenBSD, MediaTek, and Linksys. Android 6.0 and Linux are most at risk.



# Police try out new database for documenting opioid overdoses

PROVIDENCE, R.I. (AP) — Police in Massachusetts are testing a new database for documenting opioid overdoses they hope will help departments share information in real time and get people into treatment.

The database was developed by criminal justice experts Sean Varano at Roger Williams University in Rhode Island, and Pam Kelley with Kelley Research Associates in Massachusetts.

It works like this: When a department is called to an overdose, it's recorded in the system. The system then alerts the department to do a follow-up outreach visit. 
