Hackers Steal Data From Law Enforcement Sites.

The [AP](#) (8/6, Merchant, Satter) says hacker group Anonymous, responding to recent member arrests over denial of service attacks against PayPal, "hacked into some 70 mostly rural law enforcement websites in the United States, a data breach that at least one local police chief said leaked sensitive information about an ongoing investigation. The loose-knit international hacking collective posted a cache of data to the Internet early Saturday, including emails stolen from officers, tips which appeared to come from members of the public, credit card numbers and other information."

[AFP](#) (8/6, Chapman) says the group, dubbed AntiSec, claimed on Saturday that "it has 'defaced and destroyed' websites at scores of US police agencies in retaliation for the

arrest of suspected peers accused of hacking into the CIA, British crime agency SOCA, and Sony.” To support this claim, the group released the hacked info online. The [Los Angeles Times](#) (8/7, Olivarez-Giles, 657K) adds AntiSec “said its cyber-attack affected agencies in Arkansas, Kansas, Louisiana, Missouri and Mississippi. The group launched similar attacks against law enforcement in Arizona in June.”
