



(U) Georgia – FBI Arrests Man for COVID-19 Kickbacks - FBI agents arrested a Georgia man Monday on charges that he accepted kickbacks from medical testing companies by referring people for COVID-19 testing who didn't need it in order to fraudulently get Medicare reimbursement. Court documents said Erik Santos, 49, engaged in a large-scale scheme to defraud the government by soliciting and receiving payments from companies involved in medical testing, in exchange for steering people to those companies for expensive tests that Medicare would pay for. Prosecutors said he was already getting kickbacks for unnecessary cancer screenings when the pandemic hit. The FBI said Santos ran a marketing
