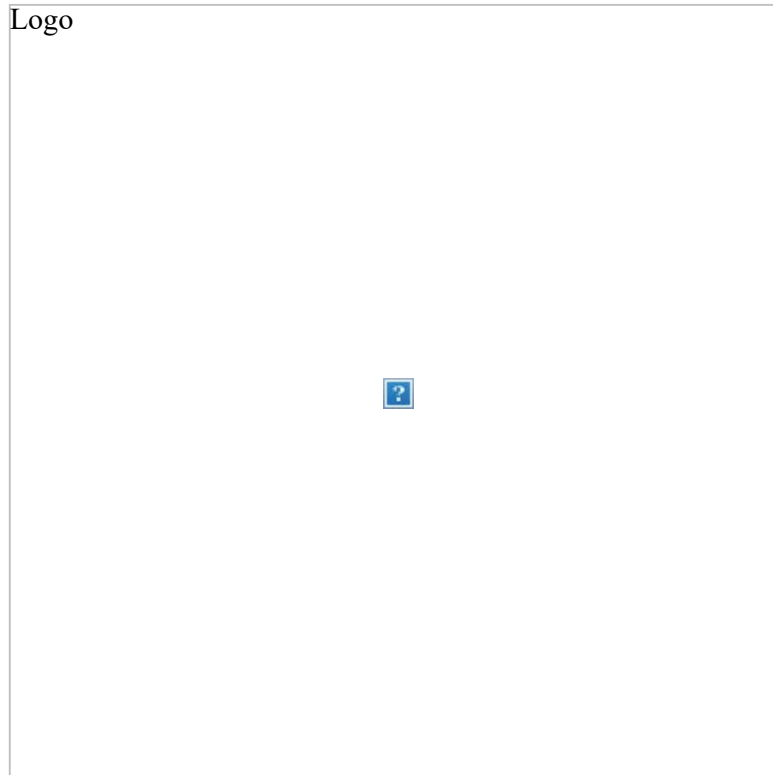

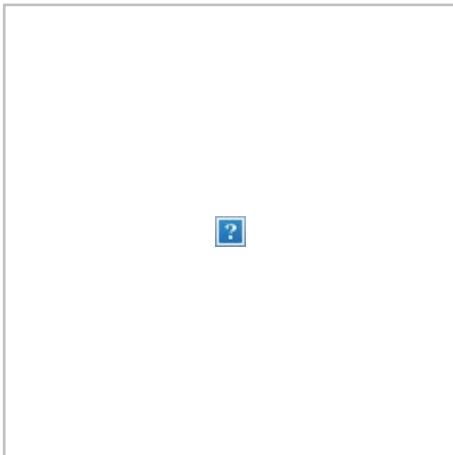

This course is to educate people about the role that language and messaging can play in the role of recovery, for not only individuals,

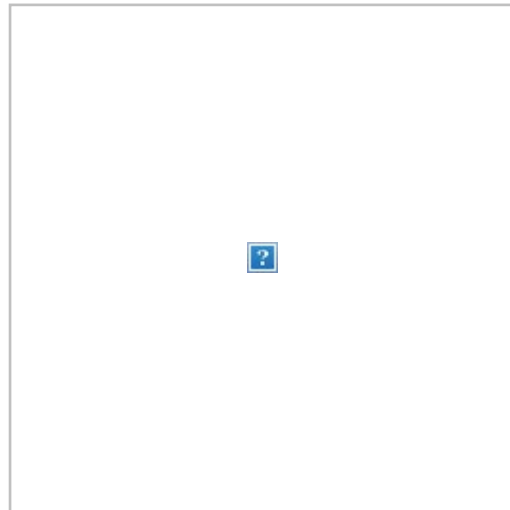
