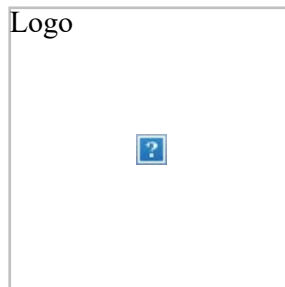

He has been retained as a forensic expert in over 50 legal cases, in both state and federal court, with respect to gambling and gambling related issues, has been influential in the passage and implementation of both state and federal initiatives regarding pathological gambling, and has appeared on numerous radio/television shows and documentaries related to gambling addiction. He has served as a consultant to financial firms, family businesses, and addiction treatment programs.
