

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding is made and entered into this 14~~th~~ day of June, 2017, by and between the CITY OF OMAHA, hereinafter referred to as "the City" and the Omaha Police Officers Association, hereinafter referred to as "OPOA."

WHEREAS, Appendix E of the Collective Bargaining Agreement between the City and the OPOA establishes a list of take home vehicles; and,

WHEREAS, Appendix E of the Collective Bargaining Agreement between the City and the OPOA contemplates that the Police Chief may make changes in the number of take home vehicles by providing notice and an opportunity to bargain; and,

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police has approached the OPOA with the desire to add six additional take home vehicles; and,

WHEREAS, City and OPOA jointly agree to amend the list in Appendix E by adding the six additional vehicles.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT AGREED BY THE PARTIES AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the City and the OPOA agree that an addition to those Take Home and City Site Vehicles shown in Appendix E of the Collective Bargaining Agreement between the parties, the Chief wants to add six (6) additional take home vehicles, and the Union agrees to such a request. The additional take home vehicles are as follows:

1. The original agreement provided for ten (10) officers who are narcotic detectives in the Criminal Investigation Bureau. Currently there are thirteen (13) narcotic detectives in the City, and the Chief will provide the three (3) additional take home vehicles, one for each of those detectives.
2. A take home vehicles for each of the following Captain positions: Admin Information Systems Captain, Support Services Captain, and Training and Community Services Captain.

2. All signatories to this Agreement warrant that they have read it and fully understand its terms; they warrant that they are of legal age and legally competent and authorized to execute this Agreement.


