Now, hey do you remember earlier--before he was transferred out, meaning [did he get into some kind of argument with uh, Deputy Al-Ghani over the TVs? The volume was too loud and then the deputy turned it off? Yeah, there was like [77. You can blame it on me or something I did]. He was just [here]. SGT. QUANICO: He was upset? Yes. SGT. QUANICO: Tell-tell me more about that. What happened exactly? Well, that was like the TV came on came in and said the TV was too loud. He said, "Why don't you turn the TV off?" He said, "All right." But [unintelligible] stuff like that. [unintelligible] so he got the TV off about 30 minutes. SGT. QUANICO: So he set your off? Yeah, and came down and got him, picked him up. SGT. QUANICO: So he was upset over that? Yeah. SGT. QUANICO: And uh, that was on Monday, right? I don't remember. SGT. QUANICO: Okay. Do you remember what deputy um--[I said Smith Al-Ghani was it her that gave him a hard time about the TV, or was it somebody else? I think it [was]. SGT. QUANICO: Okay. And what does she look like?

SEN. DEP. LUQUIN:	Did you notice that he was exerted at some point, you know, where he just couldn't catch his wind, he was just too tired to talk or anything of that sort?

SEN. DEP. LUQUIN:	Out of breath? Did he have to sit down or anything of that sort?
	He had [unintelligible].
SEN. DEP. LUQUIN:	Okay. And is this something that he normally did every day or not?

	[unintelligible] he washe was taking some prescription drugs, I don't know.
SEN. DEP. LUQUIN:	Do you know if he was taking his-his personal prescription, would he share that with you or would he [unintelligible] somebody else's?
	[unintelligible] so I don't know.
SGT. QUANICO:	[unintelligible] some coffee?
SEN. DEP. LUQUIN:	As far as you know, would he be taking somebody else's medication?
	I don't know, maybe. [unintelligible]
SEN. DEP. LUQUIN:	Okay.
SGT. QUANICO:	Hey, thank a lot uh, I don't have any other questions here, do you?
SEN. DEP. LUQUIN:	No.

discuss it with the rest of the inmates. I mean I--basically don't, you know, let's keep it to a standstill at this time, okay?
