The United States Marshals Service (USMS) is responding to your Freedom of Information/Privacy Act (FOIA/PA) request for the administrative manual, handbook or other administrative document that contains specifications for the USMS CALEA Collection and Processing System (MCCAPS).

Pursuant to your request, the Marshals Service conducted a search of its files in the Investigative Operations Division and located one page of documents responsive to your request. After carefully reviewing the record responsive to your request, we determined that one page is appropriate for release. One page is released with this letter. Investigative techniques have been deleted pursuant to exemption (b)(7)(E) of the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552



Exemption (b)(7)(E) concerns records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes the release of which would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigation or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions.

If you are not satisfied with my response to this request, you may administratively appeal by writing to the Director, Office of Information Policy (OIP), United States Department of Justice, Suite 11050, 1425 New York Avenue, NW, Washington, D.C. 20530-0001, or you may submit an appeal through OIP's FOIAonline portal by creating an account on the following web site: <https://foiaonline.regulations.gov/foia/action/public/home.portal.html>. Your appeal must be postmarked or electronically transmitted within 90 days of the date of my response to your request. If you submit your appeal by mail, both the letter and the envelope should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information/ Privacy Act Appeal."

For your information, Congress excluded three discrete categories of law enforcement and

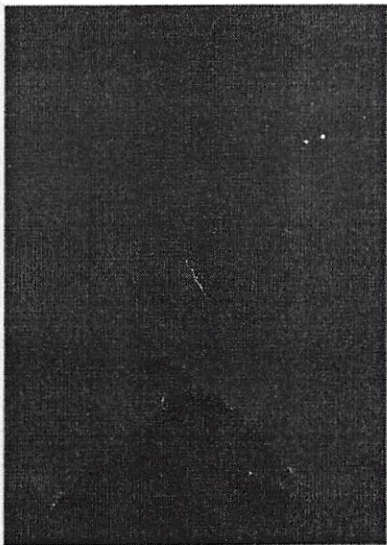
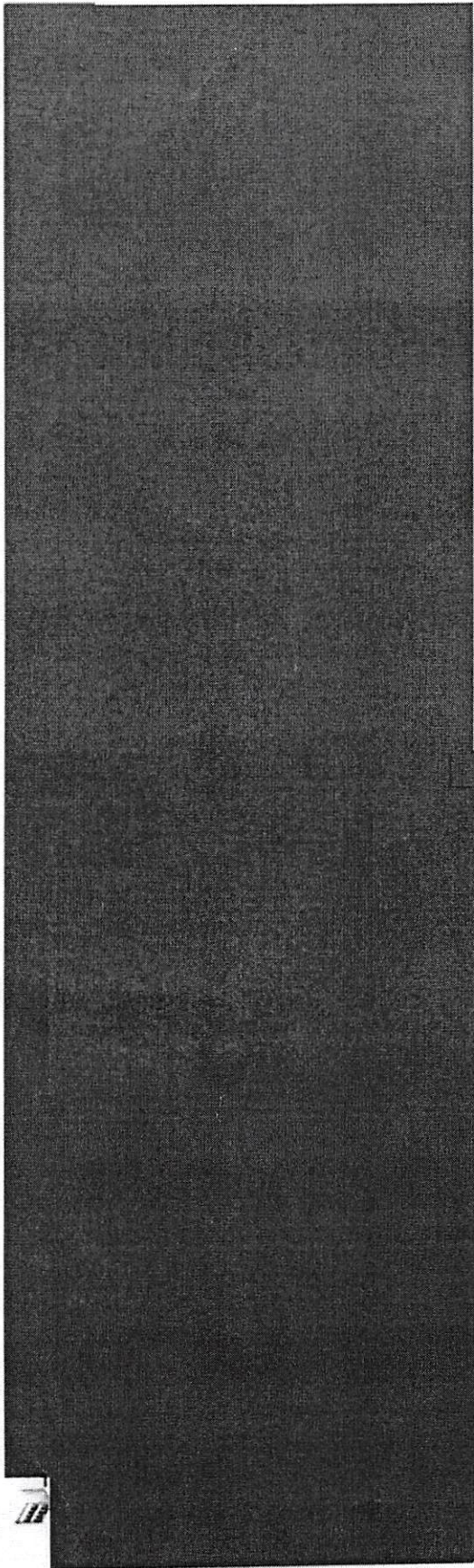
national security records from the requirements of the FOIA. See 5 U.S.C. § 552(c) (2006 & Supp. IV (2010)). This response is limited to those records that would be subject to the requirements of the FOIA. This is a standard notification that is given to all our requesters and should not be taken as an indication that excluded records do, or do not, exist.

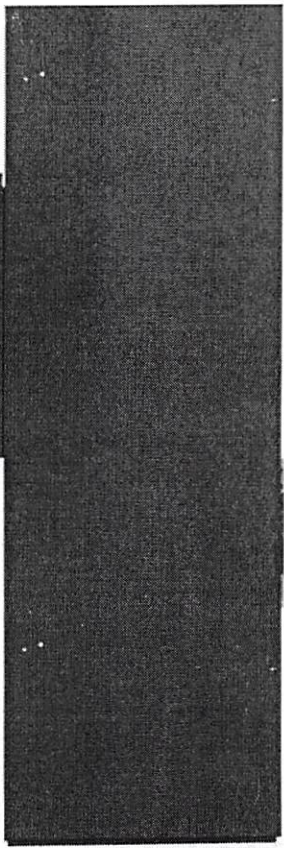
