"CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES- IS THIS TO BE TOLERATED?"

"Three or four days before the close of the production, 'The Miracle of Verdun,' the cast was notified that motion pictures were to be taken of the different scenes of the play. It was understood that these pictures were being taken for the Washington, D.C. records.

"After many scenes were carelessly taken, due to insufficient rehearsing necessary for motion pictures, the camera man, ROGER H. BARLOW, who is with the Photographic Dept. of Federal Theatre Project, asked Mr. [], Regional Director of Supervising Directors of all Western States C. C. Camps if he might be permitted to direct the action of the last scene as he had just enough film for one more scene. Permission was granted, by [].

On October 17, 1962, IC [REDACTED] determined from the records of the Los Angeles County Vital Statistics that ROGER BARLOW, white, age 24 years, occupation cameraman for Federal Theatre, address [REDACTED] Los Angeles, place of birth Minnesota, father's name HENRY KLEINSCHMIDT, mother's name ALVINA PETRICK, mother and father both born in Minnesota, and [REDACTED] white, age [REDACTED] years, of the same address, occupation stenographer, place of birth Virginia, father's name [REDACTED] mother's name [REDACTED] both born in Virginia, were married June 10, 1936. The above was filed June 11, 1936. Witnesses to the wedding were BURTON F. PERRY and HELEN MC CALL, both of [REDACTED] Los Angeles. The ceremony was performed by J. GEORGE DOON, Lutheran Pastor, 1733 North New Hampshire Avenue, Hollywood, California. Marriage license number was 8970 and neither had been married previously. The above record was located in Book 1359, Page 9. *mem*

On November 20, 1953, unconfirmed information from Source G indicates that HARRY HAY, [REDACTED] is a stockholder in International Motors (dealing in foreign cars), local office on Sunset Boulevard, Los Angeles. HAY alleged to be active in various Communist Party groups, another stockholder is ROGER RALPH BARLOW (his wife was formerly a Secretary to a Congressional Committee).

On October 23, 1962, no record of subject's employment, past or present, could be located with the business office, University of California at Los Angeles.

[REDACTED] who formerly furnished reliable information to the FBI, and who was a member of the Communist Party (CP) in Los Angeles from April 22, 1943 to the end of 1946, advised SA [REDACTED] on July 11, 1945 HARRY and [REDACTED] reside at [REDACTED] Los Angeles. Mr. [REDACTED] further advised that HARRY [REDACTED] HAY were at that time members of the Echo Park CPA Club and were both nominated as delegates to the State CPA convention to be held in Los Angeles, California on July 13 and 15, 1945. The HAYS were to sponsor a social function at their residence on Sunday, July 22, 1945 for the purpose of raising funds toward the Club's "Daily World" fund quota.

On July 2, 1955, HARRY HAY testified before the House Committee on Un-American Activities (HCUA) in Los Angeles, California in public session. He advised the Committee he was born on April 7, 1912 in England, arriving in the United States in 1916. He stated he is a United States citizen by virtue of his parents' birth. HARRY HAY had previously been identified before the Committee as a member of the CP by [REDACTED] former informant for the FBI and in particular was identified as a [REDACTED].

HAY during the course of his testimony, referred to [REDACTED] as a [REDACTED]. He further declined to furnish any information whatsoever concerning himself or the fact that he was ever employed as a teacher, had any connection with music or ever conducted classes for the California Labor School. He invoked the First and Fifth amendments to all questions concerning his former or present membership in the CP.

As of December 15, 1952, HARRY HAY no longer resided at [REDACTED] but then resided at 2146 Fargo Street, Los Angeles.

On August 14, 1961, Mrs. [redacted] telephonically advised SA [redacted] that [redacted] moved from her residence, [redacted] on August 11, 1961 along with her [redacted] to [redacted] Los Angeles.

Mrs. [redacted], formerly [redacted] [redacted] Oakland, California, [redacted] "Daily People's World" (DPW), San Francisco, California, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised SA [redacted] of the San Francisco Office of the FBI on September 27, 1950 that [redacted] California had a weekend subscription to the DPW to expire March 9, 1951, which was a yearly subscription. (It is noted subject gave an address of [redacted] California, when he registered as a [redacted] [redacted] with the Los Angeles Police Department on August 18, 1955).

The DPW, now known as the "People's World", became a weekly publication in February, 1957 and is the West Coast communist newspaper.

LA T-2, who has furnished information regarding the activities of HARRY and [redacted] was shown subject's photograph on January 8, 1963. LA T-2 does not recognize subject and does not recall ever having heard of him.
