Under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552, I hereby request access to and copies of all records held by the National Archives and Records Administration pertaining to Afro-German children born to French-African soldiers and German women during the post-World War I occupation of the Rhineland, from January 1, 1920, to December 31, 1950. This request includes both classified and unclassified documents, as well as records pending declassification.

For the purpose of this request, the records I seek include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Folders and Indexes: Any folders, indexes, or finding aids for records related to Afro-German children in the Rhineland.
- 2. Declassified Documents: Any declassified documents, reports, or communications related to Afro-German children in the Rhineland.
- 3. Classified and Pending Declassification Documents: Any classified documents or those pending declassification that pertain to Afro-German children in the Rhineland.
- 4. Transcripts: Transcripts of communications between U.S. government entities and German authorities concerning Afro-German children in the Rhineland.
- 5. Investigations: Records of any investigations or assessments conducted by U.S. agencies involving Afro-German children in the Rhineland.
- 6. Correspondences: Correspondences between U.S. government officials discussing Afro-German children in the Rhineland.
- 7. Social Reports: Documents and reports on the social and economic conditions of Afro-German children in the Rhineland.
- 8. Military Records: Information on U.S. military observations and activities related to Afro-German children in the Rhineland.
- 9. Cultural Exchanges: Records of cultural exchange programs or collaborations involving Afro-German children in the Rhineland.
- 10. Human Rights Assessments: Documents related to human rights assessments or impact studies involving Afro-German children in the Rhineland.

Should any portion of the requested records be deemed exempt from disclosure, I request the release of any reasonably segregable non-exempt portions in accordance with 5 U.S.C. § 552(b). If an entire document is exempt, I request a justification, citing specific FOIA exemptions, and provision of an exemption log as per Vaughn v. Rosen, 484 F.2d 820 (D.C. Cir. 1973).

Please note your obligation under the law not to destroy any records potentially responsive to this request. Any withholding, redaction, or destruction of responsive records without proper justification constitutes a violation of the FOIA and is subject to litigation, as confirmed in Kissinger v. Reporters Committee for Freedom of the Press, 445 U.S. 136, 150 (1980).

Thank you for your detailed response regarding my FOIA request for records relating to Afro-German children born to French-African soldiers and German women during the Post World War I occupation of the Rhinelands.

While I appreciate the information provided and the accessibility of the records at the National Archives in College Park, MD, I am specifically interested in any documents or records that may have been missed or not yet declassified relating to the subject matter. To be thorough, I request a search for any additional files, reports, or correspondences that have not been declassified but pertain to the following:

- 1. Any internal memos or communications regarding the official stance or actions taken by the U.S. government or military concerning Afro-German children and their families during the specified period.
- 2. Detailed reports or studies focusing on the social, economic, and health conditions of Afro-German children and their mothers during the occupation.
- 3. Correspondence or reports involving diplomatic interactions between the U.S., French, and German governments regarding the status and treatment of Afro-German children.
- 4. Any psychological or sociological research conducted or commissioned by the U.S. military or government during this period on the impact of occupation on mixed-race children.

I also request a thorough review of the following series and entries, and any related records that may not be immediately accessible:

Additionally, if there are any pending declassification reviews or records scheduled for future release that are relevant to my request, I would appreciate being informed about their status and potential availability dates.

- 291.12 Marriage
- 291.13 Parentage

I am specifically requesting any electronic records associated with the above decimal numbers to facilitate quicker access and review. This request includes, but is not limited to, digital versions of reports, correspondences, memos, and any other relevant documents.

Under 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(3)(C), I am requesting these records be provided in an electronic format to the extent possible. If some records are only available in physical form, please inform me of the process to access or convert these records.

Additionally, I would like to treat this communication as an appeal for any potential denial or non-disclosure of relevant records. Under 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(6)(A)(i), if any part of my request is denied, please provide the specific reasons for the denial and the name and title of the individual responsible for the decision.


