Sick Leave Pool Open Enrollment

Open enrollment for the UCF Sick Leave Pool runs through September.

To be eligible for membership, applicants must be employed with UCF continuously for at least one year and have accrued 64 hours of sick leave as of September 2022. New members are required to donate 16 hours of their sick leave; part-time employees will donate an amount proportionate to their FTE. Membership letters will be sent to new applicants by early October 2022. Current members of the Sick Leave Pool do not need to rejoin during open enrollment.
