RE: GRAMA Request Response – Healthy Together App (Twenty Labs)

Dear Caroline Haskins:

On 5/1/2020, you emailed a GRAMA request to the Division of Purchasing for information related to the State of Utah's Healthy Together App with Twenty Labs.

*"Therefore, I hereby request the following records — and please limit the time frame of all requested documents from March 1, 2020 to the time that this request is processed:*

*\* Any digital communications including but not limited to emails and text messages) as well as documents, (including but not limited to PDF, word processing, excel, and slide documents) that mention one or any of the following terms: "digital contact tracing," "contact tracing app," "exposure notification," "deconfinement app," "Healthy Together."*

*\* Any digital communications including but not limited to emails and text messages) with representatives from Apple and Google, whose emails will have the domains @apple.com or @google.com, respectively.*

*\* Any digital communications including but not limited to emails and text messages) with representatives from Twenty Co/Twenty, LLC — the people who developed the Healthy Together app.*

*\* All instructional materials, presentations and presentation materials (including recorded video and audio, PowerPoint files, prepared remarks, and slides formats), and other guidance from A) Apple and/or Google, B) Twenty Co/Twenty, LLC, or C) any company pitching the development of digital contact tracing tools or a contact tracing app. This includes (a) any pitch or slide deks, (b) any notes taken during meetings, and (c) any other document that has been used to help explain the meeting/briefing to any party, including internal documentation, public relations materials, and executive summaries.*

*\* Any contracts, purchase, orders, invoices, and receipts for services related to the Healthy Together app, or digital contact tracing, contact tracing apps, exposure notifications, or deconfinement apps generally.*

*\* Any contracts, purchase, orders, invoices, and receipts given to Twenty Co/Twenty, LLC.*

*\* A copy of any privacy impact assessments, use policies, standard operating procedures, data retention policies, legal opinions, warranties, non-disclosure agreements, contracts, liability waivers, insurance agreements, Requests for Proposals, Responses to Requests for Proposal, Memorandums of Understanding, Letters of Interest, usage policies, or informal agreements given to Twenty Co/ Twenty, LLC, or related to the Healthy Together app, or digital contact tracing, contact tracing apps, exposure notifications, or deconfinement apps generally.*

*\* Any miscellaneous documents that explain the use/function of the Healthy Together app.”*

Normally these requests come in through our online records request portal. We apologize for the delay in fulfilling your request. I have enclosed the documents as a response to your request as follows:

- A. Contracts for Twenty Labs
- B. Emails related to Twenty Labs from State Purchasing

The needs of Utah were established by local hospitals, health departments, FEMA, USDA, cities, counties, and members of the Utah Emergency Operations Center (EOC). Vendors that submitted to provide/source PPE were reviewed and vetted by the Department of Health, the Division of Purchasing, the Department of Administrative Services, the Economic Development Corporation of Utah (EDC Utah), and members of the EOC. In addition to that, the Division of Purchasing has worked with national cooperative organizations, local companies, existing statewide contract holders, and discussed issues with other states. The Division of Purchasing continues to work with vendors on state contract to get lead times on PPE and to obtain daily allocations of PPE.

The Division of Purchasing is providing you with the information it has in its possession. You may need to request additional information from other agencies in the State of Utah. This may include but is not limited to The Utah Department of Health, The Governor’s Office of Management and Budget, The Emergency Operations committee, etc.... Between March 21st and now over 700 vendors have either responded to the posted solicitation or cold called the state to provide/source PPE for the State of Utah. Vendors have and continue to be able to apply to assist the State of Utah through the [coronavirus.utah.gov/help](https://coronavirus.utah.gov/help) website and also by emailing Christopher Hughes pursuant to the publicly posted solicitation. Many of the vendors are continuing to source PPE from China. To date, the State of Utah has purchased nearly \$70 million in PPE and testing supplies.
