

#### CITATION:

For exceptionally meritorious service in response to urgent and security-sensitive tasking directed by national command authorities from 1 November 1980 to 31 October 1982. When tasked with a unique and difficult command mission, members of SEAL Team SIX exhibited unusual motivation and intrepidity in meeting the challenge of gaining an immediate operational capability in heretofore unattempted Naval Special Warfare scenarios. The task of initially outfitting the unit and attaining this sophisticated operational capability within the timeframe directed was enormous in scope and extremely dangerous in content and required each individual to perform in exceptional fashion in order to obtain maximum operational proficiency. Through this concentrated effort, SEAL Team SIX established itself as a national as well as an international asset capable of responding to the direction of the national command authorities to any worldwide contingency. The truly impressive score of unprecedented accomplishments achieved by this unit added significantly to the tactical response latitude of the United States, and its achievements in the area of unique mission capabilities caused national as well as international attention to be focused on the United States Government as the one nation fully capable of responding swiftly to sensitive special operations. By their distinctive accomplishments, resourcefulness, team spirit, and steadfast devotion to duty, the officers and enlisted personnel of SEAL Team SIX reflected great credit upon themselves and upheld the highest traditions of the United States Naval Service.
