"For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity in action while serving with SEAL Team Detachment ALFA in the Republic of Vietnam on the night of 13 March 1968. As grenadier with a SEAL combat patrol, Petty Officer BOYNTON's patrol penetrated 4,000 yards into an enemy battalion base camp area. The patrol discovered a large barracks complex containing approximately 30 well armed insurgents. The SEAL patrol engaged this larger force killing 14 of the enemy; Petty Officer BOYNTON personally killed two armed Viet Cong. During the violent fire fight, five SEAL's were wounded, including Petty Officer BOYNTON. Despite his own wounds he rushed to the side of a more seriously wounded member of the patrol, giving him life saving first aid. Finding the man unable to walk, Petty Officer BOYNTON carried him 1,000 yards as his patrol withdrew through a hail of bullets from the pursuing enemy. Petty Officer BOYNTON's courage and devotion to duty were in keeping with the highest traditions of the United States Naval Service."

"For heroic achievement while serving in armed conflict against the Communist insurgent forces in the vicinity of Vam Giong Canal, Dinh Tuong Province, Republic of Vietnam. On the morning of 16 January 1968, while serving as Rifleman on a SEAL combat mission, Petty Officer BOYNTON voluntarily joined the rear security element of his squad when the squad received intense automatic weapons cross-fire from an estimated Viet Cong company at a distance of approximately 200 meters across open paddy terrain. While the squad was pinned down the enemy attempted encirclement; however, because Petty Officer BOYNTON would not abandon his position the enemy attempt was futile. Had they succeeded in attacking from the rear, results would have been catastrophic with a possible loss of life for the entire squad. His courage, determination and utter disregard for personal safety allowed the squad to extricate itself while under a violent enemy cross-fire without injury. Despite a successful extrication from a tenuous position, Petty Officer BOYNTON held back to mark cargets for the helicopter gunships enabling them to effectively saturate enemy positions during squad withdrawal. His courage and disregard for his personal safety while exposing himself to intense hostile fire in order that his squad members could reach a degree of safety was in keeping with the highest traditions of the United States Naval Service."

SEAL Team TWO distinguished itself by exceptionally meritorious and heroic service from 1 July 1967 through 30 June 1969 in the conduct of unconventional warfare against an armed enemy in the Republic of Vietnam. Although often required to conduct their operations in almost impenetrable terrain and in a violently hostile environment, this small, elite fighting unit nonetheless accounted for numerous enemy casualties and the capture of large numbers of troops, weapons, ammunition, and documents of significant intelligence value. The outstanding valor, professionalism, and esprit de corps of SEAL Team TWO are illustrated by the following. instances: On 13 March 1968, a seven-man SEAL squad engaged an enemy force numbering approximately thirty men. During the fierce fire fight, menough five SEALS were wounded, heavy casualties were inflicted upon the enemy. Exposed to a withering hail of fire by the pursuing enemy, the SEALS withdrew through 1,000 meters of enemy-occupied territory to an extraction point, with the less seriously wounded carrying their stricken compades to safety. On another occasion, a six-man SEAL squad carried out an offensive patrol deep into the enemy-infested Rung Sat Special Zone and accounted for six enemy casualties. On still another occasion, a SEAL squad penetrated 4,000 meters into a Viet Cong base camp and overcame two of the enemy, one in hand-to-hand combat, before withdrawing to an extraction point 2,000 meters away, eluding a twenty-man element of the enemy which swept within fifteen meters of their position while attempting to locate them. Engaging this larger force, the SEALS accounted for ten enemy casualties before they were extracted. The distinguished and heroic combat record achieved by the officers and men of SEAL Team TWO reflects the highest credit upon themselves and the United States Naval Service.


