Ms. Skipwith,

First of all, I wanted to thank you for your help securing the release of the Yolo Habitat Conservation Plan/Natural Community Conservation Plan (HCP/NCCP) in the Federal Register in May 2018. I am pleased to report that all four cities and Yolo County adopted the Yolo HCP/NCCP in May and June 2018. We are expecting the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and California Department of Fish and Wildlife to issue permits at the latest by October 2018, which will mark the end of a 16-year planning process. We very much appreciate your assistance, as well as Mr. Frazer's assistance, with the final stages of this process.

Now that we are approaching implementation, the Yolo Habitat Conservancy (the joint powers agency responsible for implementing the Yolo HCP/NCCP) is taking a harder look at projects that may affect implementation of the Yolo HCP/NCCP. One such project is the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation's Yolo Bypass Salmonid Project, for which the U.S. Department of the Interior is expected to release the notice of availability of the Final EIS/EIR before Thanksgiving this year.

I was wondering if you (or Mr. Frazer) could let me know the appropriate contact within the U.S. Department of the Interior in Washington, DC responsible for approval of release of the Yolo Bypass Salmonid Project EIS/EIR in the Federal Register. The Conservancy is currently engaging cooperatively with the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation to ensure consistency between the Yolo Bypass Salmonid Project and the Yolo HCP/NCCP, but I'm interested in learning more about the process for release of the Final EIS/EIR. I understand some changes have taken place recently to this process, plus I want to ensure the Department of the Interior is

Mitigation -- While the withdrawal of our 2016 revised mitigation policies rendered that policy direction inoperative, the Service continues to work with other federal agencies and affected developers and landowners to provide recommendations on appropriate mitigation for impacts to fish and wildlife and their habitats. We have reverted back to operating under our 1981 FWS mitigation policy. Our role in most cases is as an advisory agency, although in a few circumstances (e.g., sec 10(a)(1)(B) of the ESA) we require mitigation as a condition of our permit decisions.

Thank you again for the opportunity to brief DOI and FWS leadership yesterday on the Lewis River issues.

This morning I forwarded information you had requested during the briefing (letters from two tribes, and each made reference to particular science papers so I forwarded those as well to accompany the letters). I'll repeat the offer to provide any information or documents that would aid in explaining or illustrating this issue of many parts, many parties and many years.

I apologize that I had to step out of the Thursday briefing before its conclusion. I had planned to make sure the briefing covered an important aspect of the matter, identified at the end of the informational memo forwarded from the region September 11 (and attached below). For awareness:

Changes to an existing FERC license, including Section 18 fish passage prescriptions, are procedurally complex. The Service's Biological Opinion anticipated implementation of all fish passage outlined in the Settlement Agreement, including adult and juvenile passage at Merwin and Yale Dams; the in-lieu fee option was not analyzed. If existing fish passage prescriptions change during the license period, reinitiation of consultation with FERC under section 7 of the Endangered Species Act would likely be required.

A change in fish passage prescriptions could also trigger license amendments and further NEPA compliance by FERC prior to any license amendment And adoption of any fish passage approach not contained in the Settlement Agreement may necessitate attempting to revisit that Agreement with the original signatory parties.

If pursued as a course of action, a major FERC license amendment could result in a new FERC proceeding and any party could intervene and, at the end of that proceeding, challenge FERC's adoption of the Services' new fish passage prescriptions.

These are issues of consequence in the Lewis River discussions and my interest is to include them in the "big picture", to fully inform. The work of FWS in the field and the region continues to be identification and reliance on the best available science to bear on decisions. We are in full discussions with all parties, among them the applicant, the Yakama Nation and the Cowlitz Indian Tribes with whom we also have a government-to-government duty, and NOAA Fisheries. We approach that with good work and good will.

I look forward to continuing to work with you. Thank you again.

Aurelia, this is in follow-up to your questions to Gina Shultz regarding the grant (FWS1805532) to fund NatureServe for \$250,000 to improve the blueprint of the Southeast Conservation Adaptation Strategy (SECAS) by incorporating consistent information on the location and distribution of at-risk species (listed, candidate and petititioned) and species listed in State Wildlife Action Plans. I am responding on Gina's behalf.

Over the last few weeks, we have met with the FWS project sponsors to coordinate project objectives and reduce any potential redundancy. Through these discussions, we see this project as complementary to our ongoing efforts to update current range maps for listed species. From a consultation prospective, we foresee that the improved maps and models for the SECAS footprint could inform development of large-scale programmatic consultations (e.g., a multi-state programmatic consultation that streamlined work in areas with low species value). From a species range mapping perspective, this proposed work goes beyond providing current range maps by species to combining distribution for multiple species within a habitat system.

Through this internal coordination, we have been assured that the FWS project sponsors will work closely with ES to make sure that their rangewide mapping effort is consistent with whatever protocols we use so that it produces single species maps that are consistent with our efforts. We have also agreed to collaborate on the terms and conditions for any agreement with NatureServe pending approval of this grant. We (Ecological Services) recommends that DOI support this grant.
