I am a Geologist employed by the Tenneco Oil U.K. Company. I arrived in this Country on the 10th December 1983 for an anticipated three year appointment. In the following week I made enquiries to obtain a flat in the SOUTH KENSINGTON area. On SATURDAY 17th DECEMBER 1983, at about 12.45 p.m. to 1 p.m. I was walking alone in the KNIGHTSBRIDGE Area, just looking around the area. I walked along BROMPTON ROAD past HARRODS towards KNIGHTSBRIDGE UNDERGROUND STATION. I carried on walking and turned right into a main shopping street, which I think is SLOANE STREET. I walked along SLOANE STREET and then turned right back along a street which I think is HANS CRESCENT. I walked in a circle and arrived back at the rear of HARRODS at about 1.20 p.m. I was walking along HANS CRESCENT on the side walk opposite HARRODS towards BROMPTON ROAD. I noticed several uniformed Police Officers and in fact one of them seemed to look

at me in particular. I noticed a uniformed Policeman with an Alsatian Dog who was in the road just off of the corner of the EAST side-walk. I think that I was approximately 25 feet NORTH of him when the explosion occurred. I think that I can recall a bang but I wasn't aware of any other sensation except that I was laying on the same sidewalk looking up into a shop window. I was laying on my left shoulder with my head facing NORTH. I can't recall anything inside the shop window except that it was black and grey. I rolled over onto my back and I could see that the windows of some tall buildings on the SOUTH side of BASIL STREET, were broken. I looked to my right, towards HARRODS, and I noticed a bloody mess in the road SOUTH of my position. I could distinguish a dog out of this mess and I assumed that the remainder of it was a person, but I didn't look at it for more than a second. I was aware of a large amount of glass around me but I do not recall seeing any other debris. I think that I laid on the pavement for about four minutes. I was aware by this time that a bomb had exploded. My left leg felt completely numb and I felt it to see how bad it was. My left arm was also numb but not as bad as my leg. I wasn't aware of any other injuries at this time. I had a lot of blood on my hands and chest and my clothes were torn and ripped. I was wearing a burgundy coloured wool jacket, dark blue check shirt, blue denim jeans and brown moccasin shoes. As I was laying on the side-walk I heard someone speak on a megaphone that there were two more bombs. I called out to two men who I think were wearing uniform standing on the corner of HANS CRESCENT and BASIL STREET to help me to stop the bleeding. Nothing happened

I am a Senior Registrar at the Royal National Orthopaedic Hospital, Great Portland Street, W1. On 17th December 1983, I was employed as a Senior Registrar at Westminster Hospital. During the afternoon I was called to the hospital where numerous persons had been admitted who I was later informed, had been injured in an explosion at Hans Crescent, SW1, earlier that day. Later that day I operated on (b) (6) aged 28 years. He had multiple injuries to the left side of his body. During the operation I removed a large piece of metal from his right shoulder region and other pieces from the left lower limb. I now refer to these pieces of metal as Exhibit N.T/3, which were later handed to Police. He is still an in patient at Westminster Hospital.
